Subject:- Grant of 2nd Renewal of Permission to Himalaya Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital at Chiksi, Paliganj, Patna-801110, Bihar (Inst. ID AYU0766) with intake capacity of 50 seats [instead of 100 seats] in UG BAMS courses for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder -regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Himalaya Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital at Chiksi, Paliganj, Patna-801110, Bihar (Inst. ID AYU0766)**, inspection of your college was conducted on **26.02.2024 and 27.02.2024 and revisited on 04.04.2024 & 05.04.2024 in Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **2nd Renewal of Permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG BAMS courses for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, the hearing with regard to faculty suspected to be working only on paper but physically not present was conducted on 03.07.2024 & 04.07.2024 and recommendation of the hearing committee was placed in the **97th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **12.07.2024**. The same was approved that seven of your faculty who were suspected to be working only on paper, namely **Dr. Anita Uttamrao Chapke (AYKB00208)**, **Dr. Hrushiksha Pani (AYKS00432)**, **Dr. Jyoti Kumari (AYRN00844)**, **Dr. Mahima Thomas (AYAT00757)**, **Dr. Naval Kishore Singh (AYXX00383)**, **Dr. Pravat Manjari Pani (AYRB00930)** & **Dr. Sonawane Pawan Malhari (AYST00651)** cannot be considered as regular teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter ref. no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2024 dated 16.08.2024.
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that **your college is not fulfilling the notified and approved criteria due to the following shortcoming:-**

A. Teaching staff:

07 faculties were suspected to be working on paper and called for virtual hearing. All faculties found on-paper.

C. Observation by Visitor:

- i) Kshara sutra area and cabin is not available.
 - ii) Prasuti tantra- stree roga procedures were performed in female panchakarma procedure room.
 - iii) Quality testing lab is not available as per norms.
4. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **98th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **19.07.2024**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, **the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing** vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even number** dated **30.07.2024** to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on **02.08.2024**, to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to the college with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the Academic Year 2024-25 be denied.**
5. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. HAMCH/173/24, dated 31.07.2024** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Pratima Shukla, Principal and Mr. Sandeep Kumar Singh CEO of the college**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **02.08.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

However some of the teacher prepared the research articles which are under publication process, details of the same shall be published on the website of this institution as and when published.

2.2 As examination of the 1st professional BAMS course is yet to be conducted by the university, students are yet to receive any award on university lever. However, the institution conduct many curricular and extracurricular activities at the institution lever. We have published photographs of the same on the institution website.

2.2 College has accepted that any awards and achievements received by the student is not available at the website As examination of the 1st professional BAMS course is yet to be conducted by the university, students are yet to receive any award on university lever. However, the institution conducts many curricular and extra-curricular activities at the institution lever. College has uploaded photographs of the curricular and extra-curricular

6. Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2022 and relevant regulations thereunder, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **101st Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 06.08.2024.**
7. Further, Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCSIM was in receipt of a **letter vide ref no. HAMCH/192/24 dated 06.09.2024** regarding the payment of imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 1 crore 75 Lakh and same was placed in the **106th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCSIM **held on 06.09.2024. Board accepted the request of**

the college to pay the monetary penalty of Rs. 1 crore 75 lakh in installments. Further, the 1st installment of Rs. 25 Lakh has been received through RTGS no. ICICR52024090600706478 dated 06.09.2024.

8. Thereafter, Dr. Chandra Prakash Dwivedi joined the college as Professor in the Department of Rasashastra and Bhaishajaya Kalpna on dated 18.10.2023 and on the same date his details were submitted on the OTMS. At the time of joining in this institution and submission of details on the portal his age was 64 years, 10 months and 11 days. Due to some technical issue the OTMS profile is pending with teacher and the faculty was not considered previously in the assessment report. However, the faculty is present on the day of 2nd visitation dated 04.04.2024 & 05.04.2024 and submitted the affidavit. Therefore, faculty can be considered as an eligible faculty and same was placed in the 106th Board meeting of MARBISM held on 06.09.2024 & Board approved the same.

9. Further, The Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of renewal of permission for UG (BAMS) Course under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2024-25. However, the Board decided to issue renewal of Permission for the UG course as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25, wherein it is mentioned that:-

a. "For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the Intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to 100 seats intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 101st Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 15 total eligible teaching faculties.

There is deficiency of 05 teachers for issuance of Conditional Permission for academic session 2024-25 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. Therefore, in accordance with seat reduction policy 2024-2025, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 50% of total intake capacity.

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of 2nd renewal of permission with 50 seats [instead of 100 seats] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.

10. Therefore, 2nd Renewal of Permission is granted to Himalaya Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital at Chiksl, Paliganj, Patna-801110, Bihar (Inst. ID AYU0766) with intake capacity of 50 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG BAMS course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following conditions as mentioned below: -

I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.

II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 50 seats [instead of 100 seats] shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.

III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

11. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

12. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year.

13. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

14. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- ii) All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 5 above, should be fulfilled.

15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
